#### Things to remember in Year One:

- I have PE once a week and my PE kit must be in school **EVERYDAY**. I need indoor and outdoor kit, including footwear. Our PE day is Thursday and we sometimes do yoga on Friday.
- I have a new reading book once a week. I must bring my reading book and Reading Record in EVERY DAY.
- Reading is very important but I won't get better at it if I don't practice EVERY DAY with an adult or an older sibling, I will get my dojo's if I have read with an adult and my reading record is signed.

### Learning in Year One:



Non-Fiction - We will be writing reports on LS Lowry and Florence Nightingale.

Fiction - We will read and learn Traditional Stories including: Goldilocks and the Three Bears, The Three Little Pigs, The Three Billy Goats Gruff, Little Red Riding Hood, Jack and the Beanstalk. We will write about characters and settings and write our own alternative versions of well known tales. We will also be exploring a story about a very cheeky bear!

<u>Poetry</u> - We will write simple rhyming and non—rhyming poetry based on our topics and using a range of verbs and adjectives.

#### In guided reading

In writing:

We will read a range of fiction and non-fiction texts

• We will use phonics to work out unknown words in texts



- We will learn to recognise and read tricky words
- We will talk about what we have read and learn how to find the answers to simple questions in fiction and non-fiction books.

#### In <u>Numeracy</u>

We will be learning:

Numbers & Counting: count to 100, count in 1's, 2's, 5's and 10's, count forwards and backwards, place numbers on a number line, understand and use the terms 'more' and 'less', partition 'teen' numbers and other 2 digit numbers, find doubles and halves of numbers.



**Understand addition & subtraction:** read and write number sentences, use number bonds to 10 / 20, solve one step problems, find money totals, be able to add 1 digit to 2 digit numbers, understand simple fractions,

Shape, Space & Measure: Describe position, direction and movement, be able to programme a toy to follow a route, know how to make turns, half turns and quarter turns, explore a range of shapes and explain how to classify them according to their properties. We will also look at different ways we can measure things.



#### Phonics in Year 1

In order to help us all develop into fluent readers, confident speakers and keen writers we will have daily focused phonics sessions based on the 'Letters & Sounds' programme. Outside these sessions the children will be taught to apply their phonics learning in their reading and writing tasks.
