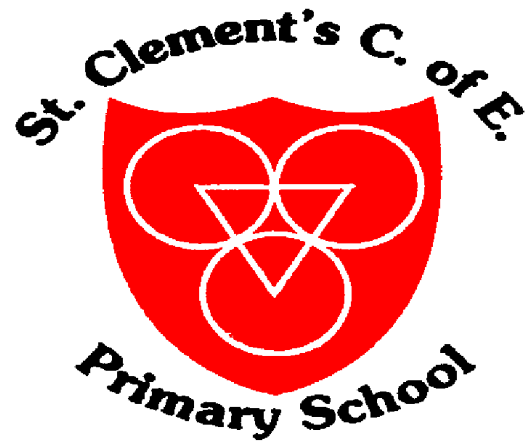

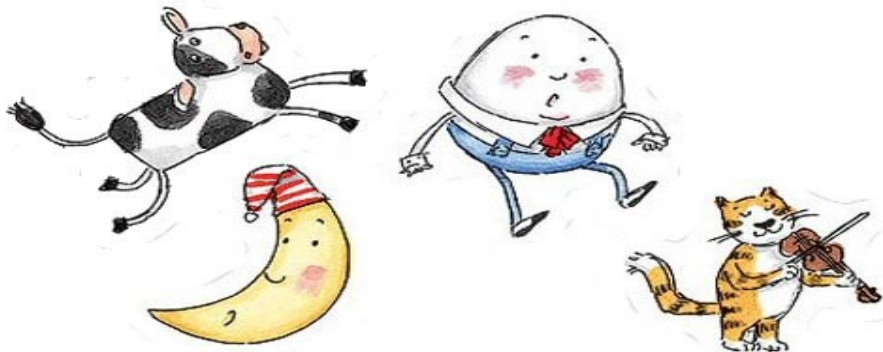

Things to remember in Nursery

- Our library day is Wednesday. Children can select a book to take home and share with their parents/carers. Books must be returned the following Wednesday so that it can be changed. Children will need their blue book bag.
- Uniform items can get lost! Please make sure that names are written in all clothes. Children struggle with shoe laces. Please try to send your child to school in shoes that don't have laces. Please encourage your child to develop their self help skills at home e.g. fastening their coats. It will really help us in school when we are getting ready for outdoor play.
- Our V.I.P system is under way. We will continue to try to see you every 5/6 weeks to update you on your child's progress and to share their next steps in learning.
- Please get involved in your child's learning journey by accessing our online tool, "Tapestry". Just ask one of us if you are unsure. Class dojo is a great way to see the rewards your child has had at school. We also share news, photos and messages. If you haven't signed up to access it yet, please ask.
- Rhyme time is on Friday morning. Two parent/carers will be invited to join us each week. We will look forward to seeing you at a session soon.

Learning in Nursery :

In Nursery this term we will be,

- Developing an understanding of our own and other people's feelings. We will continue to try to get along together and to share and take turns.
- Developing our physical gross motor skills outdoors with games and other equipment.
- Continuing with Phase 1 Letters and Sounds (phonics) to gain skills in areas such as rhyme and alliteration.
- Tuning in to listen to others, taking turns to speak, understanding and responding to a range of questions.
- Counting, learning about numbers, simple adding and taking away, shape, space and measure (size), recording simple amounts.
- Developing the physical skills needed for early writing through lots of large scale and malleable activities such as painting, creative activities, playdough, mark-making in shaving foam and so on. We will continue to give meaning to marks as we draw and write and
