

Things to remember in Nursery

- Our library day is Wednesday. Children can select a book to take home and share with their parents/carers. Books must be returned the following Wednesday so that it can be changed. Children will need their blue book bag.
- Uniform items can get lost! Please make sure that names are written in all clothes. Children struggle with shoe laces. Please try to send your child to school in shoes that don't have laces. Please encourage your child to develop their self help skills at home e.g. fastening their coats. It will really help us in school when we are getting ready for outdoor play.
- Our V.I.P system will soon be underway. We will try to see you every 5/6 weeks to update you on your child's progress and to share their next steps in learning.
- Mouse club workshops will be running again in Autumn 2. This time the focus will be on phonics (letters and sounds). We will be in touch soon with more information.
- Please get involved in your child's learning journey by accessing our online tool, "Target Tracker". Just ask one of us if you are unsure. Class dojo is a great way to see the rewards your child has had at school. We also share news, photos and messages. If you haven't signed up to access it yet, please ask.
- 'Big Read' is on Friday morning. Two parent/carers will be invited to join us each week. We will look forward to seeing you at a session soon.
- Thank you to everyone who has provided all-weather clothing bags and wellies for their children. If you haven't yet then we will be happy to show you what your child will need.

Learning in Nursery :

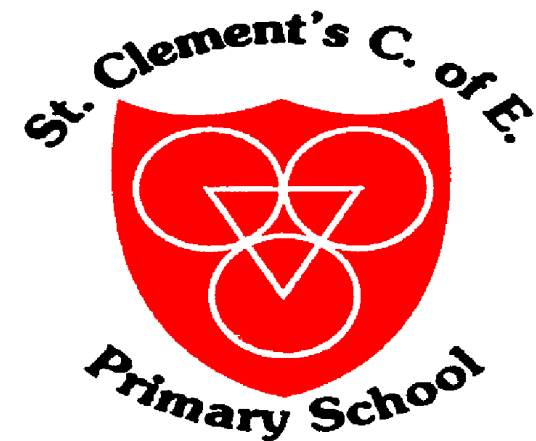
In Nursery this term we will be,

- Continuing to develop our sharing and turn taking skills and developing our awareness that some actions and words can hurt others feelings.
- Developing our independence and safety awareness.
- Continuing with Phase 1 Letters and Sounds (phonics) focusing on tuning into, listening and remembering and talking about sounds.
- Tuning in to listen to others, taking turns to speak, understanding and responding to a range of simple instructions and questions.
- Developing a deeper understanding of number through Numberblocks planning.
- Continuing to develop the physical skills needed for early writing through lots of large scale and malleable activities such as painting, creative activities, playdough, dough disco, mark-making in shaving foam and so on. We will also be encouraging children to hold their pencil correctly to develop their fine motor skills. We will continue to give meaning to marks as we draw and write and we will start to learn how to write our names.
- Learning through topic work about People who help us, Autumn and Winter seasons and celebrating different festivals such as Diwali and Christmas.

In nursery we are kind, gentle and supportive friends. We congratulate them when they have done something well. We always try our best even if something is difficult.
