

Learning in Year Two:

In <u>writing</u>

This term we will be looking at Fiction - Narrative— Reading "The Train Ride", a space story, poetry and in Non Fiction we will be writing reports around the history of transport, a recount of our school holiday, instructions and The Christmas story.

We will develop the ability to use capital letters and full stops and also begin to add detail to sentences by including noun phrases. Through drama and role play we will develop the children's ability to retell stories and identify the main events and characters in a story. We will also look closely at characters to write detailed character descriptions.


• That words belong to different groups—verbs, nouns, connectives.

In guided reading

- We will use phonics to spell out words
- We will look at word patterns that use suffixes and prefixes



In <u>numeracy</u>

We will be learning.....

- To count in tens, fives and twos from any number and back
- To link multiplication and division to counting in tens, fives and twos
- To round numbers up to the nearest 10
- To understand the operations of addition and subtraction and the associated vocabulary
- To solve problems using the appropriate operation
- To partition 2-digit numbers into tens and ones and use this to calculate
- To begin to read a scale—measure—length, mass and temperature
- To solve simple problems or puzzles involving measure
- To solve problems by collecting, sorting and organising information in simple ways. Recording working out.
