

Things to remember in Year 5:

- I need to bring my reading book and reading record into school everyday.
- I have PE on Tuesdays
- I get homework regularly, please check the due date and make sure it is in on time. Sometimes it will be a project homework, which could last 3 weeks.
- I can bring in a healthy snack from home every day. This could be a piece of fruit, a yogurt tube, raisins or something similar.
- It is expected that everyone in Year 5 will read every day. Everyone will have a guided book, and free access to our class library in order to facilitate this. Reading Records will be checked daily.
- KUNCU homework may be given out on any day and will need to be returned on the following day. Weekly homework may include spellings, research projects or basic skills practice.

Learning in Year 5:

Our Topic—Magical Monarchs

In **Literacy** this term we will be looking at the book *The Man Who Walked Between the Towers* by Modica Gerstein and writing a biographical account of Phillipe Petit's life. Later in the term, we will be reading the book *You Are a Champion* by Marcus Rashford and considering our own hopes and dreams, writing a letter to our future selves. To enhance our topic work we will also be reading lots of non-fiction around the theme of Kings and Queens and environmental issues. A key skill we will be continuing to work on this term is spelling it is important that all children work hard to practise and learn the spellings that they are given, including the use of Spelling Frame if possible.


In **Guided reading** we will continue to read a range of different text types which will be linked directly to our current topics. We will continue our journey to develop the children's enjoyment of reading and I hope that you will continue to encourage your child to read as much as possible for pleasure, both at home and in school.

In **Numeracy** we will continue our work on geometry, focusing on 2D and 3D shape, angles, and position and movement. We will then move onto measurement, including conversion between units for example hours to minutes, kilograms to grams etc

We will then move onto area and perimeter, volume and finally, Roman Numerals. At this stage in the year we will be doing lots of problem solving and reasoning and practising using the maths that we know in a range of different contexts and situations.

In order to continue to develop fluency and flexibility in our Maths learning we will continue to focus on methods and models and explaining how we worked things out.
