In **writing**

This term we will be writing both fiction and non—fiction.

Fiction: Narrative—Developing our ability to describe characters and settings using noun phrases

Poetry—writing a descriptive poem about space

Non—Fiction—writing a report about a famous explorer

We will also be learning

- That words belong to different groups—verbs, nouns, adjectives, adverbs and connectives.
- To use commas and exclamation marks in our writing.

In **guided reading**

- We will use the reading gems to help us explore the different skills we need to read effectively
- We will continue to develop our pace and fluency through regular guided practice

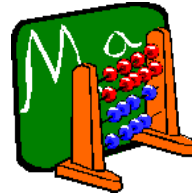

Add three 1 – digit numbers

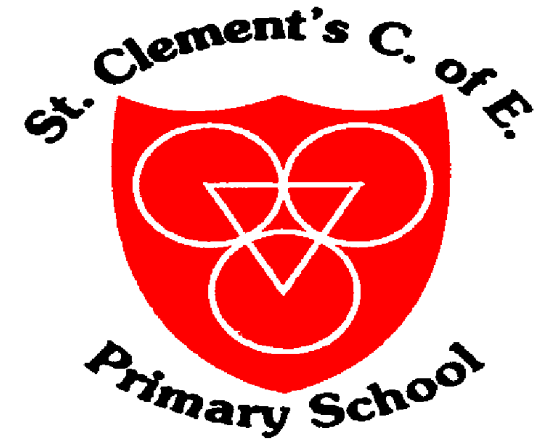
Shape

- Practise counting—in ones, twos, fives and tens, count coins, role play shopping, talk about shapes in the environment
